This is the North Florida Economic Development Partnership's (NFEDP) First Quarter Report for the 2019 Rural Regional Development Grant-D0134. The Partnership continues to enhance the region's economic development recruitment efforts in our leadership role through outreach, shared resourcing, world-wide marketing and various forms of administrative and technical assistance to our stakeholders.

The NFEDP has been working with the other two Rural Areas of Opportunity to build a strong consensus to strengthen our efforts to unify our common goals to the benefit of all rural Florida under the auspices of the Florida Rural Economic Development Association (FREDA). Since the end of last quarter, FREDA conducted the 2019 Florida Rural Economic Development Summit at the Embassy Suites in Kissimmee from February 11- 13. There were 210 attendees with eighteen receiving scholarships provided by the NFEDP to cover lodging, travel and registration.

The NFEDP website enhancement project funded by USDA is well underway. Marketing Alliance is working with NFEDP staff the stakeholders to get input as how everyone views what brand and tagline will best market the NFEDP 14-county region. Marketing Alliance provides updates to the membership at each NFEDP board meeting.

Technical assistance has continued to be a valuable component and service to all of the counties. NFEDP staff has assisted numerous counties with proposals received from site consultants, applications for the Florida Growth Grant Fund, Rural Infrastructure Fund, and the USDA Healthy Food Finance Initiative. Additionally, the NFEDP has assisted a number of communities' work through their contract deliverables and Scope of Work.

The NFEDP has expended \$47,799.41 since the Effective Date, February 7, 2019, and has accomplished no less than one hundred percent of its objectives in the Scope of Work. At this time, there have been no material changes in the Project Budget.




