Dear Mr. Gitzen:

This is the North Florida Economic Development Partnership's (NFEDP) Second Quarter Report for the 2021 Rural Regional Development Grant-D0178. The Partnership continues to enhance the region's economic development recruitment efforts in our leadership role through outreach, shared resourcing, world-wide marketing and responding to the needs of the 14-county region to provide various forms of administrative and technical assistance to our stakeholders.

The Florida Rural Economic Development Association (FREDA) in conjunction with the NFEDP is planning and coordinating the 2021 Rural Counties Day which will be held on January 26 and 27, 2022. The legislative reception will be from 6:00 pm until 8:00 pm on January 26, in the Capitol Plaza Courtyard, and the networking fish fry on the plaza courtyard January 27 from 10:00 am until 2:00 pm. Registrations for rural county booths have been robust thus far.

The NFEDP recognizes the need to assist all 14 NFEDP counties with elevating strategic sites with additional site investigation, marketing and improve broadband availability. The NFEDP counties submitted approximately 26 EFI Rural Toolkit grants to support these efforts of which all were funded by EFI. All of the NFEDP counties have closed out their EFI Consulting Services and Marketing/Training grants. The Site Preparedness grants deliverables are not yet due to close.

FREDA in conjunction with the NFEDP is promoting the 2021 Florida Rural Summit which is scheduled for December 8, 9 and 10, 2021 at the World Golf Village in St. Augustine, FL. Thus far, registrations have been robust, and NFEDP counties are utilizing NFEDP scholarships to attend.

The NFEDP has expended \$101,466.97 of the RRDG \$250,000 award since the Effective Date, February 9, 2021, and has accomplished no less than one hundred percent of its objectives in the Scope of Work.




