This is the North Florida Economic Development Partnership's (NFEDP) 2023 Fourth Quarter Report for the Rural Regional Development Grant-D0235. The Partnership continues to enhance the region's economic development recruitment efforts in our leadership role through outreach, shared resourcing, world-wide marketing and responding to the needs of the 14-county region to provide various forms of administrative, technical assistance, and capacity building scholarships to our stakeholders.

The NFEDP coordinated and conducted the FREDA Rural Summit November 29-December1, 2023. It was extremely well attended and was a huge success based on feedback from all three RAOs. Additionally, the NFEDP conducted the Rural Counties Day (RCD) Legislative Networking Reception, January 24, 2024 and the RCD Fish Fry January 25, 2024. Twenty-eight of Florida's 32 rural counties had registered booths on Capitol Plaza to market the assets of their county to all in attendance.

Ten of the 14 NFEDP counties received significant damage from Hurricane Idalia in late August. NFEDP staff continue to support state and federal efforts to provide recovery assistance to those counties impacted.

The fourth quarter reimbursement request of \$65,771.25 from the 2023 RRDG #D0235 grant facilitated the NFEDP in the accomplishment of all objectives in the RRDG D0235 grant Scope of Work.

I. Meeting Call to Order (A)

The meeting was called to order at 9:07 am by Jimmy Norris, NFEDP Chairman.

- II. <u>Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation(I)</u> Chairman Norris asked Commissioner John Meeks (Levy County) to provide the Pledge of Allegiance, and Commissioner Larry Harvey (Putnam County) to lead the invocation.
- III. <u>Welcome from Host Community</u> (I) Dixie County, County Manager, Paul Gainey provided Welcome remarks.

IV. Consideration of September 8, 2023, Meeting Minutes (A)

Diane Head, NFEDP Secretary and Executive Director CareerSource North Florida presented the draft minutes and asked for a motion. Commissioner Larry Harvey made the motion; seconded by Commissioner John Meeks. Passed unanimously.

V. Consideration of Treasurer's Report (A)

Doug Brown, Treasurer, was unavailable due to travel. Jeff Hendry presented the Treasurer's Report and asked for questions and a motion. Commissioner Thomas Demps made the motion; seconded by Commissioner Tommy Langford. Passed unanimously.

VI. Meeting Sponsore Remarks (I)

Robert Sheets, Executive Vice President, Answer-An Accenture Company, welcomed everyone and expressed his pleasure to provide lunch and cover the cost of the meeting facility.

VII. <u>Consideration of NFEDP Sponsorships for FEDC Conference and LIFT Annual</u> <u>Membership</u> (A)

Jeff Hendry explained in past years the NFEDP has been a reciprocal agreement with Marketing Opportunity with FEDC and in turn they participate in a Marketing Opportunity with the Rural Summit. Karen VanArnam made the motion, 2nd by Commissioner Larry Harvey.

IX. Recap: Rural Counties Day, January 24-25, 2024 (I)

Hendry/Board Discussion

Jeff provided a brief history of Rural Counties Day and the continued growth and success of the event.

X. <u>Florida Rural Economic Development Summit, November20-22, 2024, World Equestrian</u> <u>Center, Ocala, Florida</u> (I)

Jeff provided a brief history of the Summit and how it had grown over the years. He emphasized the need of booking your hotel room as soon as possible because you run the risk of not having one if you wait too long. The Save-the-Date notice will be emailed within the next 2 weeks.

XI. <u>Presentation: Joint County/City Meetings in Dixie Counety: A Forum for Cooperation</u> and Coordination (I)

Karen VanArnam, Dixie County Economic Development Liaison, and Paul Gainey, Dixie County Manager, briefed the group of their local efforts to improved various local initiatives, projects, and plans between the county and city of Cross City. The informed everyone of the upcoming the Town of Cross City Centennial Day celebration on Saturday, April 20, 2024.

XII. <u>Economic Development Briefing by the Former Secretary of FloridaCommerce, Laura</u> <u>DiBella, MPE</u>

Laura provided information about her current position with Adam & Reese, LLP and her assessment of the state of Florida's economy and recruitment of foreign projects.

XIII. <u>Presentation: Florida Department of Commerce: Rural Jobs Tax Credit Program</u> (I) Chris O'Kelly, State Programs and Governmental Liaison, FloridaCommerce, provided information on the Rural Jobs Tax Credit Program and the advantages and opportunities it provides.

XIV. Update on SSI Site Marketing Project (I)

Victor Leotta, Leotta Location & Design provided the status of the NFEDP's most recent initiative to select a priority site for each one of the 14 counties. He explained how the number one priority properties would be used to market them on the NFEDP website.

XV. <u>Economic Development Project Case Study: Baker County Plant AS</u> (I) Darryl Register, Executive Director Baker County Chamber of Commerce, provided a narrative on the challenges and the creative ways they were overcome regarding the recruitment of Plant AS. This is probably the largest economic development ever recruited to the NFEDP region. The development of 8.1M square feet of advanced CEA production facilities on 772 acres near US

90 & Interstate 10, where fresh produce, including, but not limited to, leafy greens and vine crops such as tomatoes, will be produced using state-of-the-art hydroponic technology. The company will be deploying a projected \$750M in capital expenditure for the project, which will scale up operations over 8 years to hire over 600 full-time employees with starting wages, including benefits, of \$21/hour.

XVI. Preparing for the Project: Action in Hamilton County (I)

Chadd Mathis, Executive Director, Hamilton County Development Authority (HCDA) provided a different kind of case study by telling the audience of how the HCDA had purchased a number of old blighted hotels and gas stations from the 50s and 60s at the first I-75 interchange in Florida traveling south from Georgia. Acquiring the blighted properties was difficult due to so many previous owners, and asbestos and lead paint contamination, plus demolition and removal. However, this multi-year initiative has resulted in prime available land which is now owned by the HCDA for economic development.

XVII. Economic Development Project Case Study: Suwannee County, Project Wave (I)

Jimmy Norris, Economic Development Director, Suwannee County Office of Economic Development, provided an overview of the initial recruitment efforts, how the county stayed in touch with the prospect after they initially selected a different county, and how those continued efforts resulted in eventually landing the project a year later.

XVIII. Legislative Update

Jeff Hendry provided legislative updates regarding the term limits for county commissioners which is dead. The Florida Jobs Growth Grant Fund is expected to funded at \$75 million as it stands right now. We are continuing to work toward eliminating the required match for the RRDG. Additionally, he explained that the Rural Bill is moving forward and hopefully funding for a revamped Rural Toolkit program.

XIX. Comments from Public (I)

Jimmy opened the floor for public comments. The owner of Suwannee Gables Motel announced that the hotel renovation was filmed by "Hotel Rescue" and will air in June or July (2024).
